- 3 Amanda Lollar gave us conflicting 4 instructions. She would first tell us, give them formula only. Then she would tell us to give them 5 mealworms only. Some of them couldn't eat the mealworms 6 7 and they weren't getting enough food. And then she told us to give them formula, then mealworms. And then she 8 went back and forth again saying, no, no, mealworms 9 10 only. And some of them weren't eating it.
 - Q. So, basically, her negligence is what caused the death of these four bats?
 - A. I don't know if they had underlying conditions. Two of them were always weak.


